B. Realization of the Research:

Description: Research in the urban area of Athens of the phenomenon of immigration entrepreneurship and the related phenomena as degradation of urban neighborhoods, ghettoization in a economic crisis condition in Greece. This survey is in a small area qualitative empirical study of entrepreneurial activity of immigrants in Athens in the period of crisis, which aims to highlight the relevant trends and dimensions of the phenomenon in three neighborhoods of the center of Athens (Kypseli , Metaksourgeio , Ambelokipoi).
